#### Hypertension: Is it worth filing for?

Since the implementation of PACT Act, one of the most filed for disability claims has been hypertension. Veterans are often shocked when they receive their rating decisions and see a grant with a percentage of only 0%. This brings up the most common questions we, as Veteran Service Officers, have been asked of "Is it worth filing a claim for hypertension" or "why did I file this claim for hypertension when I was only granted 0%?"

Ratings for hypertension are based upon a veteran's diastolic or systolic pressures at the time of the compensation exam. If a veteran does not meet the criteria listed for a 10% or higher rating, they will be provided a 0% rating, which is still service connected and subject such as receiving medication through the VA at no cost to them.

The rating criteria for hypertension is listed here and outlines what veteran's need to show in order to receive a higher rating.

60% Diastolic pressure predominantly 130 or more 40% Diastolic pressure predominantly 120 or more

20% Diastolic pressure predominantly 110 or more;

OR Systolic pressure predominantly 200 or more 10% Diastolic pressure predominantly 100 or more; OR Systolic pressure predominantly 160 or more; OR history of diastolic pressure predominantly 100 or more who requires continuous medication for control.

0% Diagnosed disability with no compensable symptoms

If a veteran disagrees with the rating they have received, they are able to appeal this decision within one year of the decision or file an increase after the one-year decision date. If the veteran chooses to file an appeal, we encourage the veteran to provide medical documentation supporting their

request for a higher evaluation for hypertension.

Veterans may also look at secondary conditions related to their hypertension. Some common secondary conditions may include kidney disease or stroke. These conditions may increase a veteran's service-connected benefits even though their primary service connection may only be 0%.

In the end, it is always the veteran's choice as to whether they feel it is worth filing the claim for hypertension. While it may not increase their payment, it could protect medication benefits or additional serviceconnected benefits later on.

Most all Posts by now, know that our membership dues no longer cover the costs and expenses of the Department of ND American Legion (Dept of ND AmLgn).



## <u>Department Treasurer</u>

Spring has finally sprung! A long-awaited season this year!

Speaking of Spring...it is also the time to report to the IRS your nonprofit status. This is done by simply filing a 990-N report before May 15 (for units that are under the \$50,000 threshold and operating in the

calendar year). If you do not operate over the typical calendar year, your 990-N is due 'the 15th day of the 5th month at the end of your tax year."

There are a number of North Dakota units that have had their nonprofit status revoked due to failure to file in the past years. Are you wondering about your unit's status? Is your unit compliant? Recently, a list with the status of every unit was sent to all District Presidents. Information on what units need to do to become compliant was also sent. Please contact your District President to find out where your unit currently stands.

All chartered American Legion Auxiliary entities are permitted by the National organization to use the name and trademarks of the American Legion Auxiliary and must comply with the national legal requirements for use of same. As an independent operated nonprofit organization, ALA entities must duly report to the Federal government via the applicable series of IRS Form 990 as well as their respective state governments.

What are the consequences of having the taxexempt status revoked? This means your unit is no longer exempt from federal income tax, cannot receive taxdeductible donations, and is subject to corporate income tax on annual revenue. You may be subject to state tax, and you are also unlikely to be considered for grants.




#### **Jamestown Post #14**
